STEVE FOSTER RETIRES



As we mentioned in last month's Tool Bits, HR Director, Steve Foster (above left), shown congratulating Rich Ring (at right) on becoming the new HR Director. Rich has more than 30 years of service here at GTD. Steve retired with several other longtime GTD employees at the end of 2014. Steve served GTD for more than 32 years, with responsibilities for purchasing, safety and environmental, human resources, the company's community service and education liaison, and editor of the Tool Bits. Steve graduated from Greenville High School in 1966, received his AAS from Montcalm Community College in 1968 followed by a BA in Business at Michigan State University in 1970. After college graduation, he would spend more than 10 years as a sales engineer and sales manager at both LexaLite Corp. of Charlevoix, and Process Equipment Corp. in Belding. Accepting an offer from GTD's late, longtime owner, Stan Ash, Steve started at GTD in early August of 1982 in what would be a long career of wearing many hats. From the very beginning, Stan encouraged Steve to be involved and partner with our educational partners and other manufacturing businesses in the area. As a result, he became involved with or a member of many organizations, boards, and advisory groups. He became known for promoting the skilled trades, career technical education, Career Showcase, student shadow days, teachers-in-industry, and business/education partnerships. He was honored by the Greenville Public Schools in 1999 as their "School Bell" award winner and was a long time advisory board member for Montcalm Community College's apprenticeship advisory group and served as the first president of the college's M-TEC Bd of Overseers (now known as the Ash Technology & Learning Center). In 2010, Steve was MCC's commencement speaker and was honored with their Stanley & Blanche Ash **Distinguished Service Award.** For almost 20 years, Steve has been a trustee and former president of the Education Foundation of Greenville. Currently, he is president of the Montcalm Area Intermediate School District's Board of Education and is a lifetime honorary member and past president of the American **Apprenticeship Round Table.**


