MATT CAVERLEY - 25 YEARS



Matt Caverley became the 96th employee to reach 25 years of service at Greenville Tool & Die on May 16th. Born and raised in Greenville near the Caverley family farm, Matt is the son of Larry and Cherilyn Caverley

and has one older sister Tammy. Matt is pictured with his two children. His daughter Ashley who just finished her freshman year at Central Michigan University and son Brendan who just finished his junior year at Greenville High School. Matt attended St. Charles Catholic School and began working for Grandpa Caverley and Uncle Dennis at the ripe age of 12. He was feeding calves, cleaning stalls, and baling hay or straw all thru school. Matt would later attend Greenville public schools graduating from Greenville High School in 1991. While in high school, Matt was on the golf team, took wood working class, and drafting classes. After high school, Matt went off to Ferris State University, then returned back to the family farm to work a while before enrolling into Montcalm Community College to pursue his degree in business. After the spring semester of college on May 16, 1994, Matt had an opportunity to fill a full-time/part-time position at Tomco Tool & Die. This was a summer job doing many numerous tasks that needed to be done. By the end of the summer, the company was impressed with Matt and what he offered, and Matt was liking the atmosphere, the hands-on work, and the good people that worked there, so together they agreed to make Matt a full-time employee. Matt would attend MCC, complete his on the job training, and receive his journeyman card in December of 1999. He would become a CAD designer in Ideas, work in the QC department, and work close with the Laser source. Upon GTD purchasing Tomco Tool in December 2003, Matt would join GTD and continue his expertise in die making, QC, and the past 8 years cross trained in Catia design, surfacing, and die making.

Aside from die making Matt enjoys spending time with his two children Ashley and Brendan, coaching youth soccer, which Matt has done on and off the last 6 years, mushrooming, grilling and preparing a main course to perfection, and hunting. When questioned about the changes Matt has witnessed over the past quarter century, he was quick to say technology, the repeatability of the CNC mills, simulation saving time in the die build process. When asked what he enjoyed the most about Greenville Tool & Die Matt said, it was working will all the great people we have here. Getting to know his co-workers in and outside the shop, he said we have a lot in common, yet we have a lot of diversity. He also stated, "It doesn't seem like 25 years, it went really dang fast."

Matt has been a great teacher to our young apprentices. In addition, he has always been willing to learn and stay on the edge of technology as the company advances. Because of this Greenville Tool & Die continues to be successful. On behalf of all of us, we thank Matt for his outstanding commitment to GTD while sharing his wealth of knowledge over the past 25 years and wish him continued success in his career.
