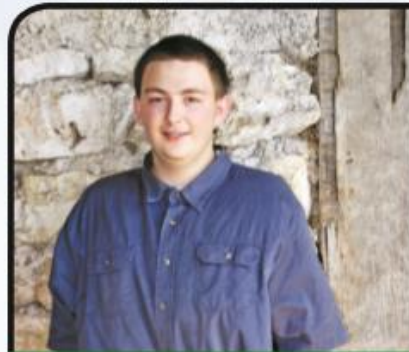

## MATT CAVERLEY – 25 YEARS

Aside from die making Matt enjoys spending time with his two children Ashley and Brendan, coaching youth soccer, which Matt has done on and off the last 6 years, mushrooming, grilling and preparing a main course to perfection, and hunting. When questioned about the changes Matt has witnessed over the past quarter century, he was quick to say technology, the repeatability of the CNC mills, simulation saving time in the die build process. When asked what he enjoyed the most about Greenville Tool & Die Matt said, it was working with all the great people we have here. Getting to know his co-workers in and outside the shop, he said we have a lot in common, yet we have a lot of diversity. He also stated, "It doesn't seem like 25 years, it went really dang fast."

Matt has been a great teacher to our young apprentices. In addition, he has always been willing to learn and stay on the edge of technology as the company advances. 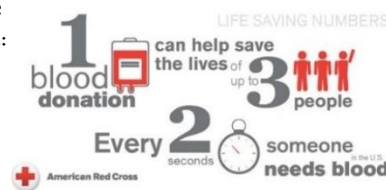
